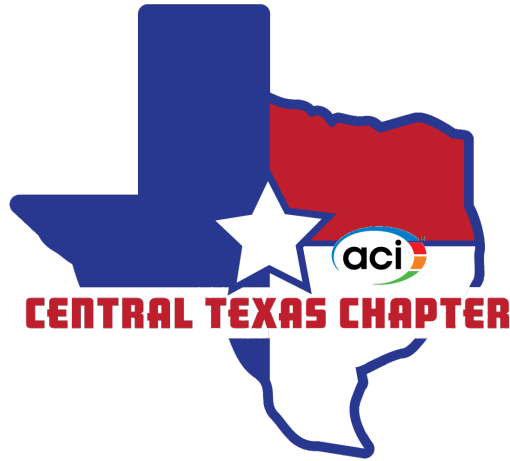




Professional Development Hours (PDH's)
